ORDER

A Review of Respondent's Compliance with Terms of Settlement and Licensure Status was considered before the full Board on the 13th day of June 2008. Present were: Respondent Wayne Dunetz, P.A.-C., via video conference from Las Vegas, NV, Board members Javaid Anwar, M.D., Sohail Anjum, M.D., Jean Stoess, M.A., Charles N. Held, M.D., Cindy Lamerson, M.D., S. Daniel McBride, M.D. and Benjamin J. Rodriguez, M.D. Board member Rene West was absent. Also in attendance were Shawna Rice, Compliance Officer, Lyn Beggs, Deputy General Counsel, and Robert Bryant, Deputy Attorney General.

Following discussion and having heard from Respondent as well as the Compliance Officer and legal staff of the Board, and with good cause appearing, the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners hereby enters its Order as follows:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Respondent is hereby reinstated to practice as a physician assistant but remains on probation and must remain in compliance with the terms of said probation set forth in the Settlement, Waiver and Consent Agreement, accepted and adopted by the Board on June 8, 2007, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Respondent may not begin actively practicing unless and until he provides the Board with the identity of his supervising physician and the physician is approved by the Board to act as the supervising physician of Respondent, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that Respondent will comply with the recommendations of the confidential evaluation completed by Melissa Piasecki, M.D. on May 8, 2008, during the remaining duration of his probation, if Respondent does not comply with the recommendations as set forth in the evaluation during his probation, it may result in the imposition of the stayed revocation of his license after proper notice and an opportunity to be heard on the matter.
