ORDER OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION

On March 14, 2011, Board staff presented evidence and information to the Investigative Committee of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners, composed of Charles N. Held, M.D., Chair, Theodore B. Berndt, M.D., Member, and Valerie Clark, BSN, RHU, LUTCF, Member, regarding Michael Kaplan, M.D. Upon review of the evidence and information presented by Board staff, the Investigative Committee hereby **IMMEDIATELY SUSPENDS** the license to practice medicine of Dr. Michael Kaplan (hereinafter "Dr. Kaplan") pursuant to NRS 630.326(1) based upon the following preliminary findings:

1. Dr. Kaplan is a physician licensed to practice medicine in the state of Nevada and was originally licensed on December 2, 1989. Dr. Kaplan practices medicine in the Las Vegas area and his primary specialty is listed with the Board as urology.

2. Through a joint investigation with the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), it was discovered that from on or about December 20, 2010 until the beginning of March 2011, Dr. Kaplan directed his staff to re-use endocavity needle guides used during the performance of prostate/rectal biopsies.

3. The endocavity needle guides are single-use-only medical devices, however staff members have verified that per Dr. Kaplan's directives, the needle guides were used on an average of three to five times before being discarded after becoming too bloody.

4. Upon completion of a procedure, the endocavity needle guides would be washed in hot water, scrubbed for tissue matter and soaked in Cidex, a solution utilized to disinfect and sterilize medical devices, and then re-used for the next procedure.

1	5.	During investigation of the matter, Dr. Kaplan admitted to investigative staff and to
2	2 FDA investigators that he had re-used the endocavity needle guides during biopsy procedures.	

The Investigative Committee believes that that the health, safety and welfare of the public is at imminent risk of harm by Dr. Kaplan's verified and admitted re-use of single-use-only medical devices, namely endocavity needle guides, during the performance of prostate biopsies and that a summary suspension of Dr. Kaplan's medical license is necessary to remove said risk of imminent harm to the health, safety and welfare of the public. Accordingly, pursuant to NRS 630.326(1):

8 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the license to practice medicine in the state of Nevada of
9 Michael Kaplan, M.D., (License No. 5983) is hereby suspended until further order of the
10 Investigative Committee or Board; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a hearing be set within forty-five (45) days of this Order regarding this matter pursuant to NRS 630.326(2) to determine whether this suspension may continue unless the parties mutually agree to a longer period of time.
