SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is hereby entered into by and between the Investigative Committee (IC) of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners (Board), composed at the time of filing the formal Complaint of Theodore B. Berndt, M.D., Chairman, Valerie J. Clark, BSN, RHU, LUTCF, Member, and Michael J. Fischer, M.D., Member, in the above-captioned matter, by and through its counsel, Erin L. Albright, Esq., Board Deputy General Counsel and attorney for the IC, and Steven A. Holper, M.D. (Respondent), by and through his counsel, L. Kristopher Rath, Esq., as follows:

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2013, the Board's IC filed a formal Complaint in the above-captioned matter charging Respondent with engaging in conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the Nevada Medical Practice Act (MPA), i.e., Chapter 630 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC), to wit: Count I: two (2) counts of malpractice as defined by NAC 630.040, two (2) violations of NRS 630.301(4), malpractice and Count II: five (5) counts of failure to maintain timely, legible, accurate and complete medical records relating to the diagnosis, treatment and care of a patient, five (5) violations of NRS 630.3062(1); and

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WHEREAS, Respondent received a copy of the formal Complaint, reviewed it, understands it, and consulted with competent counsel, L. Kristopher Rath, Esq., concerning the nature and significance of the formal Complaint. Respondent is fully advised concerning his rights and defenses to the formal Complaint, as well as the possible sanctions that may be imposed if the Board finds and concludes that he violated one or more provisions of the MPA; and

WHEREAS, Respondent understands and agrees that he has certain rights under the United States Constitution and the Constitution of the state of Nevada, as well as under the MPA and the Nevada Administrative Procedures Act (NRS Chapter 233B), including, but not limited to, the right to a formal hearing on the charges against him, the right to representation by counsel in the preparation and presentation of his defense, the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him, the right to written findings, conclusions and an order regarding a final decision by the Board, and the right to judicial review of any final decision by the Board that is adverse to him; and

WHEREAS, Respondent understands and agrees that this Settlement Agreement (Agreement) is entered into by and between himself and the Board's IC, and not with the Board, but that the IC will present this Agreement to the Board for consideration in open session at a meeting duly noticed and scheduled. Respondent understands that the IC shall advocate approval of this Agreement by the Board, but that the Board has the right to decide in its own discretion whether or not to approve this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Respondent understands and agrees that if the Board approves the terms, covenants and conditions of this Agreement, then the terms, covenants and conditions enumerated below shall be binding and enforceable upon him.

NOW THEREFORE, in order to resolve this matter and all charges alleged by the Board's IC in the above-captioned matter, Respondent and the IC hereby agree to the following terms, covenants and conditions:

1. <u>Jurisdiction</u>. Respondent is, and at all times mentioned in the formal Complaint filed in the above-captioned matter was licensed to practice medicine in the state of Nevada

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subject to the jurisdiction of the Board to hear and adjudicate charges of violations of the MPA, and to impose sanctions as provided by the MPA.

2. Representation by Counsel/Knowing, Willing and Intelligent Agreement.

Respondent is represented by above-identified counsel herein, whom Respondent covenants and agrees is fully capable, competent and fully advised in these circumstances, and Respondent further covenants and agrees that he enters into this Agreement knowingly, willingly, and intelligently after full consultation with and upon advice of above-identified counsel.

3. Waiver of Rights. In connection with this Agreement, and the terms, covenants and conditions contained herein, Respondent knowingly, willingly and intelligently, with the advice of above-identified counsel, waives all rights in connection with this Agreement, and the terms, covenants and conditions contained herein, and with the understanding that Respondent knowingly, willingly and intelligently waives all rights arising under or pursuant to the United States Constitution, the constitution of the state of Nevada, the MPA, NRS Chapter 233B, and any other statutory rights that may be available to him or that may apply to him in connection with the proceedings on the formal Complaint filed herein, the defense of said formal Complaint, the adjudication of the charges in said formal Complaint, and the imposition of sanctions.

Respondent agrees that the matter of the formal Complaint herein may be settled and resolved in accordance with this Agreement without a hearing or any further proceedings, and without the right to judicial review.

- 4. Acknowledgement of Reasonable Basis to Proceed. Respondent covenants and agrees that the Board's IC has a reasonable basis to believe that Respondent engaged in one or more instances of conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the provisions of the MPA.
- 5. <u>Consent to Entry of Order</u>. Respondent concedes only that the Board has sufficient evidence to proceed with its formal Complaint against him, but does not concede or admit to such allegations, which he expressly denies, and which, but for his desire to reach this compromise, he would contest at the formal hearing of this matter. In order to resolve the matter of these disciplinary proceedings pending against him without incurring any further costs and expense

of providing a defense to the formal Complaint, Respondent hereby agrees¹ that the Board may issue an order finding that Respondent engaged in conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the MPA, to wit: two (2) counts of malpractice as defined by NAC 630.040, two (2) violations of NRS 630.301(4), malpractice, as set forth in Count I of the formal Complaint, and five (5) counts of failure to maintain timely, legible, accurate and complete medical records relating to the diagnosis, treatment and care of a patient, five (5) violations of NRS 630.3062(1), as set forth in Count II of the formal Complaint.

For the aforementioned violations, Respondent shall:

- a. Allow his license to be suspended, with said suspension stayed and Respondent placed on probation for a period of twenty-four (24) months from the date of the Board's acceptance, adoption and approval of this Agreement, with an obligation to comply with the following terms and conditions:
 - (1) Respondent shall complete forty (40) hours of Continuing Medical Education (CME), in person, regarding the subject of pain management.² The aforementioned hours of CME shall be in addition to any CME requirements that are regularly imposed upon Respondent as a condition of licensure in the state of Nevada and shall be approved by Board prior to their completion;
 - (2) Respondent shall remain in compliance with all state and federal laws pertaining to the practice of medicine and the prescribing, administering or dispensing of any dangerous drug or controlled substance during his probation;
 - (3) Respondent shall obtain, if necessary, and maintain all appropriate registrations and licenses with the DEA and the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy to prescribe, administer or dispense any dangerous drugs or controlled substances during his probation;

² Respondent shall receive credit for all CME hours in pain management that are completed in person after January 31, 2013, and prior to the Board's acceptance, adoption and approval of this Agreement.

¹ All agreements and admissions made by Respondent are solely for final disposition of this matter and any subsequent related administrative proceedings or civil litigation involving the Board and Respondent. Therefore, said agreements and admissions by Respondent are not intended or made for any other use, such as in the context of another state or federal government regulatory agency proceeding, state or federal civil or criminal proceeding, or any other state or federal court proceeding, or any credentialing or privileges matter.

- (4) For the first six (6) months of Respondent's probation, the Board shall conduct ten (10) random medical record reviews per month. After the first six (6) months of Respondent's probation, the Board shall conduct ten (10) random medical record reviews every three (3) months for the remainder of Respondent's probation. Respondent shall bear all expenses related to the Board's random medical record reviews.
- Respondent's patient sign-in sheets from ten (10) random dates. Respondent shall provide the requested patient sign-in sheets to the Board within ten (10) business days of said request. Upon its review of the patient sign-in sheets, the Board may request the medical records for any patient designated on the patient sign-in sheets for that month. Respondent shall provide the Board with any requested medical records for any patient designated on the patient sign-in sheets for that month within ten (10) business days of the Board's request. If the Board requests the medical records for any patient designated on the patient sign-in sheets, the Board shall notify Respondent, in writing, at the time of its request whether the costs associated with the review of the requested medical records shall be paid in full by Respondent. If the costs of the review of the medical records shall be paid in full by Respondent, then the review shall count as one of the random reviews of medical records outlined in paragraph 5(a)(4);
- (6) On successful completion of the probation requirements set forth herein, Respondent shall be removed from probation, his license to practice medicine in the state of Nevada shall be restored to good standing, and the suspension shall be rescinded. The Board shall issue an order to this effect when the circumstances warrant.
- b. Respondent shall receive a public reprimand;

c. Pursuant to NRS 622.400, Respondent shall reimburse to the Board the sum of \$7,500.00, the current amount of the costs incurred by the Board to investigate and prosecute this matter, along with the costs to conclude the matter, if any. The costs shall be paid to the

Board within twelve (12) months of the Board's acceptance, adoption and approval of this Agreement; and

- d. The terms of this Agreement shall be reported as required by law.
- 6. Release From Liability. In execution of this Agreement, the Respondent, for himself, his executors, successors and assigns, hereby releases and forever discharges the state of Nevada, the Board, the Nevada Attorney General, and each of their members, agents and employees in their representative capacities, and in their individual capacities, from any and all manner of actions, causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims and demands whatsoever, known and unknown, in law or equity, that Respondent ever had, now has, may have or claim to have, against any or all of the persons or entities named in this paragraph arising out of or by reason of this investigation, this Agreement or its administration.
- 7. Procedure for Adoption of Agreement. The IC and counsel for the IC shall recommend approval and adoption of the terms, covenants and conditions contained herein by the Board in resolution of the formal Complaint pending herein against Respondent. In the course of seeking Board approval, adoption and/or acceptance of this Agreement, counsel for the IC may communicate directly with the Board staff and the adjudicating members of the Board.

Respondent acknowledges that such contacts and communication may be made or conducted ex parte, without notice or opportunity to be heard on his part or on the part of his counsel until the public Board meeting where this Agreement is discussed, and that such contacts and communications may include, but not be limited to, matters concerning this Agreement, the formal Complaint, and any and all information of every nature whatsoever related to the formal Complaint or the proceedings herein against Respondent. The IC and its counsel agree that Respondent and/or his counsel may appear at the Board meeting where this Agreement is

discussed, and if requested, respond to any questions that may be addressed to the IC or its counsel.

- 8. Effect of Acceptance of Agreement by Board. In the event the Board approves, accepts and adopts the terms, covenants and conditions set out in this Agreement, counsel for the IC will cause the Board's order accepting, adopting and approving this Agreement to be entered herein, ordering full compliance with the terms herein and ordering that this case be closed, subject to the provisions in Paragraph 5.
- 9. Effect of Rejection of Agreement by Board. In the event the Board does not accept, approve and adopt the terms, covenants and conditions set out in this Agreement, this Agreement shall be null, void, and of no further force and effect except as to the following covenant and agreement regarding disqualification of adjudicating Board panel members. Respondent agrees that, notwithstanding rejection of this Agreement by the Board, nothing contained herein and nothing that occurs pursuant to efforts of the IC or its counsel to seek acceptance and adoption of this Agreement by the Board shall disqualify any member of the adjudicating panel of the Board from considering the charges against Respondent and participating in the disciplinary proceeding in any role, including adjudication of the case. Respondent further agrees that he shall not seek to disqualify any such member absent evidence of bad faith.
- 10. <u>Binding Effect</u>. If this Agreement is approved by the Board, Respondent covenants and agrees that this Agreement is a binding and enforceable contract upon Respondent and the Board's IC which contract may be enforced in a court or tribunal having jurisdiction. Further, this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon each of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, personal representatives, assigns and successors in interest of each party and shall resolve any and all matters, actions and investigations, including specifically, BME investigative case numbers 09-11423, 09-11548, 09-11791, 10-11967, 10-12141, 10-12479, 11-12868, 12-13744, 12-13927 and 12-14128, that were open and/or pending on or before January 31, 2013. The above-listed open and/or pending investigations and matters shall be deemed closed with no Board action and no admissions by Respondent.

11. Forum Selection Clause. Respondent covenants and agrees that in the event either party is required to seek enforcement of this Agreement in the district court, he consents to such jurisdiction, and covenants and agrees that exclusive jurisdiction shall be in the Second Judicial District Court of the state of Nevada and for the county of Washoe.

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12. Attorneys' Fees and Costs. Respondent covenants and agrees that in the event an action is commenced in the district court to enforce any provision of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover costs and reasonable attorneys' fees.

13. Failure to Comply With Terms. In the event the Board enters its order approving, accepting and adopting this Agreement, should Respondent fail to comply with any term or condition recited herein, the Board shall be authorized to immediately suspend Respondent's license to practice medicine in the state of Nevada pending an order to show cause hearing, which will be duly noticed and scheduled. Further, failure to comply with the terms recited herein may result in additional disciplinary action being initiated against Respondent for a violation of an order of the Board in accordance with NRS 630.3065(2)(a). Moreover, the failure of Respondent to reimburse the Board for monies agreed to be paid as a condition of settlement may subject Respondent to civil collection efforts.
