FIRST AMENDED COMPLAINT

The Investigative Committee (IC) of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners (Board), composed of, at the time of filing, Wayne Hardwick, M.D., Chairman, Mr. M. Neil Duxbury, Member, and Aury Nagy, M.D., Member, by and through Robert Kilroy, Esq., Board General Counsel and attorney for the IC, having a reasonable basis to believe that Robert W. Watson, M.D. (Respondent), violated the provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapter 630 and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 630 (collectively, Medical Practice Act), hereby issues its formal First Amended Complaint (Complaint), stating the IC's charges and allegations as follows:

- 1. Respondent is currently licensed in active status (License No. 9076), and has been so licensed by the Board since July 12, 1999, pursuant to the provisions of the Medical Practice Act.
- 2. Patient A was a forty-eight (48)-year-old female at the time of the incidents in question. Her true identity is not disclosed in this Complaint to protect her identity, but her identity is disclosed in the Patient Designation contemporaneously served on Respondent with this Complaint.

- 4. On September 10, 2010, Respondent discussed the various treatment options with Patient A. After this discussion, Patient A agreed to undergo a colorectal anastomosis.
- 5. On September 13, 2010, Respondent performed a colorectal anastomosis on Patient A.
 - 6. Postoperatively, Patient A began passing green enteric fluid from her vagina.
- 7. On September 24, 2010, a different physician performed an exploratory laparotomy. During this subsequent surgery, it was discovered that the physician assistant who assisted Respondent placed the circular staple device in Patient A's vagina instead of the rectum. leading to a direct colovaginal anastomosis instead of a colorectal anastomosis.
- 8. Respondent's failure to recognize the fact that the physician assistant's placement of the staple device was incorrect prior to stapling the anastomosis constitutes malpractice.

COUNT I

NAC 630.230(1)(i)

(Failure to Supervise Physician Assistant)

- 9. All of the allegations contained in the above paragraphs are hereby incorporated by reference as though fully set forth herein.
- 10. NAC 630.230 states that a person who is licensed as a physician shall not engage in prohibited professional conduct.
- 11. NAC 630.230(1)(i) states that it is prohibited professional conduct for a physician to fail to provide adequate supervision of a physician assistant.
- 12. As demonstrated by, but not limited to, the above-outlined facts, Respondent failed to provide adequate supervision of his physician assistant when he failed to recognize the fact that the physician assistant placed the staple device in the wrong location prior to stapling the anastomosis.

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13. By reason of the foregoing, Respondent is subject to discipline by the Board as provided in NRS 630.352.

WHEREFORE, the Investigative Committee prays:

- 1. That the Board give Respondent notice of the charges herein against him and give him notice that he may file an answer to the Complaint herein as set forth in NRS 630.339(2) within twenty (20) days of service of the Complaint;
- 2. That the Board set a time and place for a formal hearing after holding an Early Case Conference pursuant to NRS 630.339(3);
- 3. That the Board determine the sanctions it will impose if it finds Respondent violated the Medical Practice Act;
- 4. That the Board make, issue and serve on Respondent, in writing, its findings of fact, conclusions of law and order, which shall include the sanctions imposed; and
- 5. That the Board take such other and further action as may be just and proper in these premises.
