COMPLAINT

The Investigative Committee (IC) of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners (Board) hereby issues this formal Complaint (Complaint) against Harish S. Hosalkar, M.D. (Respondent), a licensed physician in Nevada. After investigating this matter, the IC¹ has a reasonable basis to believe that Respondent has violated provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapter 630 and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 630 (collectively, the Medical Practice Act). The IC alleges the following facts:

- Respondent was at all times relevant to this Complaint a physisican holding an 1. active license to practice medicine in the State of Nevada. His license was originally issued on March 5, 2014, and is currently licensed in active status (License No. 15200).
- 2. On November 16, 2018, the California Medical Board issued a Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order (Order). This Order disciplined Respondent with a stayed revocation of his California license to practice medicine and placed him on probation for three (3) years. Additionally, the Order stated that Respondent would take educational courses for each year of his probation, and these courses shall include, but not be limited to, research protocols, principle investigators' roles and responsibilities, the Institutional Review Board's (IRB) protocols and processes and ethics in research.

3. Respondent did not report the Order to the Board within 30 days following its issuance to Respondent.

Count I

NRS 630.301(3) (Disciplinary Action by Another State Medical Board)

- 4. All of the allegations in the above paragraphs are hereby incorporated as if fully set forth herein.
- 5. Pursuant to NRS 630.301(3), any disciplinary action, including, without limitation, the revocation, suspension, modification or limitation of a license to practice any type of medicine, taken by another state, among other entities, is grounds for initiating disciplinary action against a licensee.
- 6. The California Medical Board Order constitutes disciplinary action by another state entity.
- 7. By reason of the foregoing, Respondent is subject to discipline by the Board as provided in NRS 630.352.

Count II

NRS 630.306(1)(k) (Failure to Report Within 30 Days)

- 8. All of the allegations in the above paragraphs are hereby incorporated as if fully set forth herein.
- 9. NRS 630.306(1)(k) provides that failure to report in writing, within 30 days, to the Board any disciplinary action taken against the licensee by another state is grounds for initiating disciplinary action against a licensee.
- 10. Respondent violated NRS 630.306(1)(k) when he failed to notify the Board, in writing, within 30 days, of the California Medical Board's Order of November 16, 2018.
- 11. By reason of the foregoing, Respondent is subject to discipline by the Board of as provided in NRS 630.352.

WHEREFORE, the IC prays:

1. That the Board give Respondent notice of the charges herein against him and give him notice that he may file an answer to the Complaint herein as set forth in NRS 630.339(2)

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within twenty (20) days of service of the Complaint;

- 2. That the Board set a time and place for a formal hearing after holding an Early Case Conference pursuant to NRS 630.339(3);
- 3. That the Board determine what sanctions to impose if it finds and concludes that there has been a violation or violations of the Medical Practice Act committed by Respondent;
- 4. That the Board make, issue and serve on Respondent its findings of fact, conclusions of law and order, in writing, to include sanctions to be imposed; and
- 5. That the Board take such other and further action as may be just and proper in these premises.
