COMPLAINT

The Investigative Committee (IC) of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners (Board), by and through Aaron Bart Fricke, Esq., Senior Deputy General Counsel and attorney for the IC, having a reasonable basis to believe that Jose Ramon Troche, PA (Respondent), violated the provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapter 630 and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 630 (collectively, the Medical Practice Act), hereby issues its Complaint, stating the IC's charges and allegations as follows:

- Respondent was at all times relevant to this Complaint a licensed physician 1. assistant holding an active license to practice medicine in the State of Nevada (License No. 545). Respondent was licensed by the Board on October 20, 1997.
- Respondent engaged in an inappropriate personal relationship with Patient A, who 2. was a patient under Respondent's care. Patient A's name is not disclosed in this Complaint to protect his or her identity, but his or her identity is disclosed in the Patient Designation contemporaneously served on Respondent with a copy of this Complaint.

COUNT I

NRS 630.301(9) (Disreputable Conduct)

- 3. All of the allegations contained in the above paragraphs are hereby incorporated by reference as though fully set forth herein.
- NAC 630.380(1)(m) provides that violation of a provision of NRS 630.301 to 4. 630.3065, inclusive, is grounds for initiating disciplinary action against a physician assistant.
- 5. NRS 630.301(9) provides that engaging in conduct that brings the medical profession into disrepute is grounds for or initiating disciplinary action or denying licensure.
- 6. Respondent's inappropriate personal relationship with Patient A, a patient under Respondent's care, is conduct that brings the medical profession into disrepute.
- By reason of the foregoing, Respondent is subject to discipline by the Board as 7. provided in NRS 630.352.

WHEREFORE, the IC prays:

- 1. That the Board give Respondent notice of the charges herein against him and give him notice that he may file an answer to the Complaint herein as set forth in NRS 630.339(2) within twenty (20) days of service of the Complaint;
- 2. That the Board set a time and place for a formal hearing after holding an Early Case Conference pursuant to NRS 630.339(3);
- 3. That the Board determine what sanctions to impose if it finds and concludes that there has been a violation or violations of the Medical Practice Act committed by Respondent;
- 4. That the Board make, issue and serve on Respondent its findings of fact, conclusions of law and order, in writing, to include sanctions to be imposed; and
- 5. That the Board take such other and further action as may be just and proper in these premises.
