NEVADA STATE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS

COMPLAINT

The Investigative Committee¹ (IC) of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners (Board), by and through BRANDEE MOONEYHAN, J.D., Deputy General Counsel and attorney for the IC, having a reasonable basis to believe that VISHAL VERMA, M.D., (Respondent) violated the provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapter 630 and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 630 (collectively, the Medical Practice Act), hereby issues its Complaint, stating the IC's charges and allegations as follows:

- 1. Respondent was at all times relative to this Complaint a medical doctor holding an active license to practice medicine in the State of Nevada (License No. 15952). Respondent was originally licensed by the Board on July 1, 2015.
- 2. On January 31, 2020, the Maryland State Board of Physicians (Maryland Board) issued a Final Decision and Order concluding that Respondent had dispensed prescription medicine without a required dispensing permit, willfully made a false representation when applying for licensure, and engaged in unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine. As a consequence, the Maryland Board reprimanded Respondent; placed him on probation for a minimum of six (6) months, with conditions that he complete continuing medical education ///

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courses on telemedicine, prescribing of medication, and recordkeeping; and imposed against him a civil fine of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000).

On February 18, 2020, Respondent timely informed the Board of the discipline 3. imposed on him by the Maryland Board.²

COUNT I

NRS 630.301(3) - Disciplinary Action by Another Licensing Board

- All of the allegations contained in the above paragraphs are hereby incorporated by 4. reference as though fully set forth herein.
- 5. NRS 630.301(3) provides that any disciplinary action, including, without limitation, the revocation, suspension, modification or limitation of a license to practice any type of medicine, taken by another state is grounds for initiating disciplinary action.
- Maryland Board took disciplinary action against Respondent on 6. January 31, 2020.
- By reason of the foregoing, Respondent is subject to discipline by the Nevada 7. Board as provided in NRS 630.352.

WHEREFORE, the Investigative Committee prays:

- That the Board give Respondent notice of the charges herein against him and give 1. him notice that he may file an answer to the Complaint herein as set forth in NRS 630.339(2) within twenty (20) days of service of the Complaint;
- That the Board set a time and place for a formal hearing after holding an 2. Early Case Conference pursuant to NRS 630.339(3);
- That the Board determine what sanctions to impose if it determines there has been 3. a violation or violations of the Medical Practice Act committed by Respondent;
- That the Board award fees and costs for the investigation and prosecution of this 4. case as outlined in NRS 622.400;

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² As a result of the Maryland Board's disciplinary action, the medical regulatory boards of at least 19 other states have likewise imposed discipline against Respondent, namely: Alabama, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Illinois, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Mississippi, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Rhode Island, Tennessee, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

- 5. That the Board make, issue and serve on Respondent its findings of fact, conclusions of law and order, in writing, that includes the sanctions imposed; and
- 6. That the Board take such other and further action as may be just and proper in these premises.
