ORDER DENYING APPLICATION FOR LICENSURE

The application of Zvika Jacob Schreiber, M.D. (Applicant), for a license to practice medicine in the State of Nevada came before the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners (Board) at its regularly scheduled meeting on Friday, March 5, 2021. The meeting of the Board was held exclusively through telephonic means pursuant to the Emergency Directives issued by the Governor of Nevada, and a quorum was present. At the appearance, proof was made to the satisfaction of the Board that the application ought to be denied.

IT IS SO ORDERED that the application be, and hereby is, DENIED because the application contained false, misleading, inaccurate and incomplete statements in violation of NRS 630.304(1), which constitutes sufficient grounds for denying licensure. Further, the application contains the same, repeated false, misleading, inaccurate and incomplete statements as Applicant made to other state medical boards, for which Applicant was previously disciplined by those other boards, which also constitutes sufficient grounds for denying licensure pursuant to NRS 630.301(3).

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The Applicant may appeal this Order pursuant to NRS 630.200¹.

¹ NRS 630.200 Delay or denial of application for license to practice medicine: Grounds; notice; appeal. 1) The Board may deny an application for a license to practice medicine for any violation of the provisions of this chapter or regulations of the Board. 2) The Board shall notify an applicant of any deficiency which prevents any further action on the application or results in the denial of the application. The applicant may respond in writing to the Board concerning any deficiency and, if the applicant does so, the Board shall respond in writing to the contentions of the applicant. 3) Any unsuccessful applicant may appeal to the Board if the applicant files the appeal within 90 days after the date of the rejection of the application by the Board.
