10 **SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

11 The Investigative Committee (IC) of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners  
12 (Board), by and through Donald K. White, J.D., Deputy General Counsel for the Board and  
13 attorney for the IC, and Robert J. Futoran, M.D. (Respondent), a licensed physician in Nevada,  
14 assisted by his attorney, Katherine Turpen, Esq., of the law firm of John H. Cotton & Associates,  
15 hereby enter into this Settlement Agreement (Agreement) based on the following:<sup>1</sup>

16 **A. BACKGROUND**

17 1. Respondent is a medical doctor currently licensed in active status by the Board  
18 pursuant to Chapter 630 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and Chapter 630 of the Nevada  
19 Administrative Code (NAC) (collectively, the Medical Practice Act) to practice medicine in Nevada.  
20 His license was originally issued on June 29, 1985 (License No. 5253).

21 2. On June 14, 2021, in Case No. 21-9314-1, the IC filed a formal Complaint (Complaint)  
22 charging Respondent with violating the Medical Practice Act. Specifically, the Complaint alleges one  
23 (1) violation of NRS 630. Count I alleges a violation of NRS 630.304(1) Misrepresentation in  
24 Renewing License. By reason of the foregoing, Respondent is subject to discipline by the Board as  
25 provided in NRS 630.352.

27 <sup>1</sup> All agreements and admissions made by Respondent are solely for final disposition of this matter and any  
28 subsequent related administrative proceedings or civil litigation involving the Board and Respondent. Therefore,  
Respondent's agreements and admissions are not intended or made for any other use, such as in the context of another  
state or federal government regulatory agency proceeding, state or federal civil or criminal proceeding, any state or  
federal court proceeding, or any credentialing or privileges matter.

1           3.       Respondent was properly served with a copy of this Complaint, has reviewed and  
2 understands this Complaint, and has had the opportunity to consult with competent counsel concerning  
3 the nature and significance of this Complaint.

4           4.       Respondent is hereby advised of his rights regarding this administrative matter, and of  
5 his opportunity to defend against the allegations in the Complaint. Specifically, Respondent has certain  
6 rights in this administrative matter as set out by the United States Constitution, the Nevada  
7 Constitution, the Medical Practice Act, the Nevada Open Meeting Law (OML), which is contained in  
8 NRS Chapter 241, and the Nevada Administrative Procedure Act (APA), which is contained in NRS  
9 Chapters 233B and 622A. These rights include the right to a formal hearing on the allegations in the  
10 Complaint, the right to representation by counsel, at his own expense, in the preparation and  
11 presentation of his defense, the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses and evidence against  
12 him, the right to written findings of fact, conclusions of law and order reflecting the final decision of  
13 the Board, and the right to judicial review of the Board's order, if the decision is adverse to him.

14           5.       Respondent understands that, under the Board's charge to protect the public by  
15 regulating the practice of medicine, the Board may take disciplinary action against Respondent's  
16 license, including license probation, license suspension, license revocation and imposition of  
17 administrative fines, as well as any other reasonable requirement or limitation, if the Board concludes  
18 that Respondent violated one or more provisions of the Medical Practice Act.

19           6.       Respondent understands and agrees that this Agreement, by and between Respondent  
20 and the IC, is not with the Board, and that the IC will present this Agreement to the Board for  
21 consideration in open session at a duly noticed and scheduled meeting. Respondent understands  
22 that the IC shall advocate for the Board's approval of this Agreement, but that the Board has  
23 the right to decide in its own discretion whether or not to approve this Agreement. Respondent  
24 further understands and agrees that if the Board approves this Agreement, then the terms and  
25 conditions enumerated below shall be binding and enforceable upon him and the Board.

26 **B.       TERMS & CONDITIONS**

27           **NOW, THEREFORE**, in order to resolve the matters addressed herein, i.e., the matters  
28 with regard to the Complaint, Respondent and the IC hereby agree to the following terms and

1 conditions:

2 1. **Jurisdiction.** Respondent is, and at all times relevant to the Complaint has been, a  
3 physician licensed to practice medicine in Nevada subject to the jurisdiction of the Board as set  
4 forth in the Medical Practice Act.

5 2. **Representation by Counsel/Knowing, Willing and Intelligent Agreement.**  
6 Respondent acknowledges he is represented by counsel, and wishes to resolve the matters  
7 addressed herein with said counsel. Respondent agrees that if representation by counsel in this  
8 matter materially changes prior to entering into this Agreement and for the duration of this  
9 Agreement, that counsel for the IC will be timely notified of the material change. Respondent  
10 agrees that he knowingly, willingly and intelligently enters into this Agreement after deciding to  
11 have a full consultation with and upon the advice of legal counsel.

12 3. **Waiver of Rights.** In connection with this Agreement, and the associated terms  
13 and conditions, Respondent knowingly, willingly and intelligently waives all rights in connection  
14 with this administrative matter. Respondent hereby knowingly, willingly and intelligently waives  
15 all rights arising under the United States Constitution, the Nevada Constitution, the Medical  
16 Practice Act, the OML, the APA, and any other legal rights that may be available to him or that  
17 may apply to him in connection with the administrative proceedings resulting from the Complaint  
18 filed in this matter, including defense of the Complaint, adjudication of the allegations set forth in  
19 the Complaint, and imposition of any disciplinary actions or sanctions ordered by the Board.  
20 Respondent agrees to settle and resolve the allegations of the Complaint as set out by this  
21 Agreement, without a hearing or any further proceedings and without the right to judicial review.

22 4. **Acknowledgement of Reasonable Basis to Proceed.** As of the time of entering  
23 into this Settlement Agreement, the allegations of the Complaint remain unproven. Respondent  
24 acknowledges that the IC believes it has a reasonable basis to allege that Respondent engaged in  
25 conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the Medical Practice Act. The IC acknowledges  
26 Respondent is not admitting that the IC's claims/counts as alleged in the Complaint have merit  
27 and Respondent is agreeing to resolve this matter to avoid the costs of hearing and potential  
28 subsequent litigation. Respondent asserts if this matter were to proceed to hearing, he has

1 evidence, witnesses, expert witness(es) and defenses to the counts/claims alleged in the  
2 Complaint, but for the purposes of resolving the matter and for no other purpose, Respondent  
3 waives the presentation of evidence, witnesses, expert witnesses, and defenses in order to  
4 effectuate this Agreement.

5         **5. Consent to Entry of Order.** In order to resolve this Complaint pending against  
6 Respondent, Respondent hereby agrees that the Board may issue an order finding that Respondent  
7 engaged in conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the Medical Practice Act. Accordingly,  
8 the following terms and conditions are hereby agreed upon:

9             a. Respondent admits to Count I, one (1) violation of NRS 630.304(1)  
10 Misrepresentation in Renewing License.

11             b. Respondent will pay the costs and expenses incurred in the investigation  
12 and prosecution of the above-referenced matter within sixty (60) days of the Board's acceptance,  
13 adoption and approval of this Agreement, the current amount being one thousand four hundred  
14 fifteen dollars and eighty cents (\$1,415.80), not including any costs that may be necessary to  
15 finalize this Agreement.

16             c. This Agreement shall be reported to the appropriate entities and parties as  
17 required by law, including, but not limited to, the National Practitioner Data Bank.

18             d. Respondent shall receive a Public Letter of Reprimand.

19         **6. Release from Liability.** In execution of this Agreement, Respondent understands  
20 and agrees that the State of Nevada, the Board, and each of its members, staff, counsel,  
21 investigators, experts, peer reviewers, committees, panels, hearing officers, consultants and agents  
22 are immune from civil liability for any decision or action taken in good faith in response to  
23 information acquired by the Board. NRS 630.364(2)(a). Respondent agrees to release the State of  
24 Nevada, the Board, and each of its members, staff, counsel, investigators, experts, peer reviewers,  
25 committees, panels, hearing officers, consultants and agents from any and all manner of actions,  
26 causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims and demands whatsoever, known and  
27 unknown, in law or equity, that Respondent ever had, now has, may have or claim to have, against  
28 any or all of the persons, government agencies or entities named in this paragraph arising out of,

1 herein.

2 7. **Procedure for Adoption of Agreement.** The IC and counsel for the IC shall  
3 recommend approval and adoption of the terms and conditions of this Agreement by the Board in  
4 resolution of this Complaint. In the course of seeking Board acceptance, approval and adoption of  
5 this Agreement, counsel for the IC may communicate directly with the Board staff and the  
6 adjudicating members of the Board.

7 Respondent acknowledges that such contacts and communications may be made or  
8 conducted ex-parte, without notice or opportunity to be heard on his part until the public Board  
9 meeting where this Agreement is discussed, and that such contacts and communications may  
10 include, but may not be limited to, matters concerning this Agreement, the Complaint and any and  
11 all information of every nature whatsoever related to this matter. The IC and its counsel agree that  
12 Respondent and/or Counsel for the Respondent may appear at the Board meeting where this  
13 Agreement is discussed and, if requested, respond to any questions that may be addressed to the  
14 IC or the IC's counsel.

15 8. **Effect of Acceptance of Agreement by Board.** In the event the Board accepts,  
16 approves and adopts this Agreement, the Board shall issue a final order, making this Agreement  
17 an order of the Board, and, pending full compliance with the terms herein, the case shall be closed  
18 and all remaining claims arising out of the Complaint shall be dismissed with prejudice.

19 9. **Effect of Rejection of Agreement by Board.** In the event the Board does not  
20 accept, approve and adopt this Agreement, this Agreement shall be null, void and of no force and  
21 effect except as to the following agreement regarding adjudications: (1) Respondent agrees that,  
22 notwithstanding rejection of this Agreement by the Board, nothing contained in this Agreement  
23 and nothing that occurs pursuant to efforts of the IC to seek the Board's acceptance of this  
24 Agreement shall disqualify any member of the adjudicating panel of the Board from considering  
25 this Complaint and from participating in disciplinary proceedings against Respondent, including  
26 adjudication of this case; and (2) Respondent further agrees that he shall not seek to disqualify any  
27 such member absent evidence of bad faith.

28 10. **Binding Effect.** If approved by the Board, Respondent understands that this

1 Agreement is a binding and enforceable contract upon Respondent and the Board.

2 11. **Forum Selection Clause.** The parties agree that in the event either party is  
3 required to seek enforcement of this Agreement in district court, the party's consent to such  
4 jurisdiction and agree that exclusive jurisdiction shall be in the Second Judicial District Court,  
5 State of Nevada, Washoe County.

6 12. **Attorneys' Fees and Costs.** The parties agree that in the event an action is  
7 commenced in district court to enforce any provision of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall  
8 be entitled to recover reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.


9 13. **Failure to Comply with Terms.** Should Respondent fail to comply with any term  
10 or condition of this Agreement once the Agreement has been accepted, approved and adopted by  
11 the Board, the IC shall be authorized to immediately suspend Respondent's license to practice  
12 medicine in Nevada pending an Order to Show Cause Hearing, which will be duly noticed.  
13 Failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement, including failure to pay any fines, costs,  
14 expenses or fees owed to the Board, is a failure to comply with an order of the Board, which may  
15 result in additional disciplinary action being taken against Respondent. NRS 630.3065(2)(a).

1 Further, Respondent's failure to remit payment to the Board for monies agreed to be paid  
2 as a condition of this Agreement may subject Respondent to civil collection efforts.


