10 **SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

11 The Investigative Committee (IC) of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners
12 (Board), by and through Sarah A. Bradley, J.D., MBA, Deputy Executive Director for the Board
13 and attorney for the IC, and Randi Fultz Grinsell, M.D., (Respondent), a licensed physician in
14 Nevada, assisted by her attorney, Chelsea R. Hueth, Esq., of the law firm of McBride Hall, hereby
15 enter into this Settlement Agreement (Agreement) based on the following:¹

16 **A. BACKGROUND**

17 1. Respondent is a medical doctor currently licensed in active status by the Board
18 pursuant to Chapter 630 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and Chapter 630 of the Nevada
19 Administrative Code (NAC) (collectively, the Medical Practice Act) to practice medicine in
20 Nevada. Her license was originally issued on April 9, 2003 (License No. 10448).

21 2. On June 28, 2021, in Case No. 21-27634-1, the IC filed a formal Complaint
22 (Complaint) charging Respondent with violating the Medical Practice Act. Specifically, the
23 Complaint alleges Count I: one (1) violation of NRS 630.301(4), Malpractice; Count II: one (1)
24 violation of NRS 630.3062(1)(a), Failure to Maintain Complete Medical Records; and Count III:
25 one (1) violation of NRS 630.306(1)(b)(2), Violation of Standards of Practice Established by

Respondent's agreements and admissions are not intended or made for any other use, such as in the context of another
state or federal government regulatory agency proceeding, state or federal civil or criminal proceeding, any state or
federal court proceeding, or any credentialing or privileges matter.

1 Regulation. By reason of the foregoing, Respondent is subject to discipline by the Board as
2 provided in NRS 630.352.

3 3. Respondent was properly served with a copy of this Complaint, has reviewed, and
4 understands this Complaint, and has had the opportunity to consult with competent counsel
5 concerning the nature and significance of this Complaint.

6 4. Respondent is hereby advised of her rights regarding this administrative matter,
7 and of her opportunity to defend against the allegations in the Complaint. Specifically,
8 Respondent has certain rights in this administrative matter as set out by the United States
9 Constitution, the Nevada Constitution, the Medical Practice Act, the Nevada Open Meeting Law
10 (OML), which is contained in NRS Chapter 241, and the Nevada Administrative Procedure Act
11 (APA), which is contained in NRS Chapter 233B. These rights include the right to a formal
12 hearing on the allegations in the Complaint, the right to representation by counsel, at her own
13 expense, in the preparation and presentation of her defense, the right to confront and cross-
14 examine the witnesses and evidence against him, the right to written findings of fact, conclusions
15 of law and order reflecting the final decision of the Board, and the right to judicial review of the
16 Board's order, if the decision is averse to her.

17 5. Respondent understands that, under the Board's charge to protect the public by
18 regulating the practice of medicine, the Board may take disciplinary action against Respondent's
19 license, including license probation, license suspension, license revocation and imposition of
20 administrative fines, as well as any other reasonable requirement or limitation, if the Board
21 concludes that Respondent violated one or more provisions of the Medical Practice Act.

22 6. Respondent understands and agrees that this Agreement, by and between
23 Respondent and the IC, is not with the Board, and that the IC will present this Agreement to the
24 Board for consideration in open session at a duly noticed and scheduled meeting. Respondent
25 understands that the IC shall advocate for the Board's approval of this Agreement, but that the
26 Board has the right to decide in its own discretion whether to approve this Agreement.
27 Respondent further understands and agrees that if the Board approves this Agreement, then the
28 terms and conditions enumerated below shall be binding and enforceable upon him and the Board.

1 **B. TERMS & CONDITIONS**

2 **NOW, THEREFORE**, to resolve the matters addressed herein, i.e., the matters about the
3 Complaint, Respondent and the IC hereby agree to the following terms and conditions:

4 1. **Jurisdiction**. Respondent is, and always relevant to the Complaint has been, a
5 physician licensed to practice medicine in Nevada subject to the jurisdiction of the Board as set
6 forth in the Medical Practice Act.

7 2. **Representation by Counsel/Knowing, Willing and Intelligent Agreement**.
8 Respondent acknowledges she is represented by counsel and wishes to resolve the matters
9 addressed herein with said counsel. Respondent agrees that if representation by counsel in this
10 matter materially changes prior to entering into this Agreement and for the duration of this
11 Agreement, that counsel for the IC will be timely notified of the material change. Respondent
12 agrees that she knowingly, willingly, and intelligently enters into this Agreement after deciding to
13 have a full consultation with and upon the advice of legal counsel.

14 3. **Waiver of Rights**. In connection with this Agreement, and the associated terms
15 and conditions, Respondent knowingly, willingly, and intelligently waives all rights in connection
16 with this administrative matter. Respondent hereby knowingly, willingly and intelligently waives
17 all rights arising under the United States Constitution, the Nevada Constitution, the Medical
18 Practice Act, the OML, the APA, and any other legal rights that may be available to him or that
19 may apply to him in connection with the administrative proceedings resulting from the Complaint
20 filed in this matter, including defense of the Complaint, adjudication of the allegations set forth in
21 the Complaint, and imposition of any disciplinary actions or sanctions ordered by the Board.
22 Respondent agrees to settle and resolve the allegations of the Complaint as set out by this
23 Agreement, without a hearing or any further proceedings and without the right to judicial review.

24 4. **Acknowledgement of Reasonable Basis to Proceed**. As of the time of entering
25 into this Settlement Agreement, the allegations of the Complaint remain unproven. Respondent
26 acknowledges that the IC believes it has a reasonable basis to allege that Respondent engaged in
27 conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the Medical Practice Act. The IC acknowledges
28 Respondent is not admitting that the IC's claims/counts as alleged in the Complaint have merit

1 and Respondent is agreeing to resolve this matter to avoid the costs of hearing and potential
2 subsequent litigation. Respondent asserts if this matter were to proceed to hearing, she has
3 evidence, witnesses, expert witness(es) and defenses to the counts/claims alleged in the
4 Complaint, but for the purposes of resolving the matter and for no other purpose, Respondent
5 waives the presentation of evidence, witnesses, expert witnesses, and defenses to effectuate this
6 Agreement.

7 5. Consent to Entry of Order. To resolve this Complaint pending against
8 Respondent, Respondent hereby agrees that the Board may issue an order finding that Respondent
9 engaged in conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the Medical Practice Act.
10 Accordingly, the following terms and conditions are hereby agreed upon:

11 a. Respondent consents to the Board entering an order finding that she
12 engaged in one (1) violation of NRS 630.301(4), Malpractice.

13 b. Respondent shall pay a fine of one thousand five hundred dollars
14 (\$1,500.00) within sixty (60) days of the Board's acceptance, adoption, and approval of this
15 Agreement.

16 c. Respondent will pay the costs and expenses incurred in the investigation
17 and prosecution of this matter within sixty (60) days of the Board's acceptance, adoption and
18 approval of this Agreement, in the amount of four thousand three hundred sixty-two dollars and
19 thirty-six cents (\$4,362.36).

20 d. Respondent shall complete three (3) hours of Continued Medical Education
21 (CME) related to communication with patients and/or relaying testing results to patients in a
22 timely manner, in addition to the required CMEs to maintain licensure in the State of Nevada.

23 e. This Agreement shall be reported to the appropriate entities and parties as
24 required by law, including, but not limited to, the National Practitioner Data Bank.

25 f. Respondent shall receive a Public Letter of Reprimand.

26 g. The remaining counts of the Complaint (Counts II and III), and any other
27 claims arising from the Board's corresponding investigative case file(s), shall be dismissed with
28 prejudice.

1 6. Release from Liability. In execution of this Agreement, Respondent understands
2 and agrees that the State of Nevada, the Board, and each of its members, staff, counsel,
3 investigators, experts, peer reviewers, committees, panels, hearing officers, consultants and agents
4 are immune from civil liability for any decision or action taken in good faith in response to
5 information acquired by the Board. NRS 630.364(2)(a). Respondent agrees to release the State of
6 Nevada, the Board, and each of its members, staff, counsel, investigators, experts, peer reviewers,
7 committees, panels, hearing officers, consultants and agents from any and all manner of actions,
8 causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims and demands whatsoever, known and
9 unknown, in law or equity, that Respondent ever had, now has, may have or claim to have, against
10 any or all of the persons, government agencies or entities named in this paragraph arising out of,
11 or by reason of, this investigation, this Agreement or the administration of the case referenced
12 herein.

13 7. Procedure for Adoption of Agreement. The IC and counsel for the IC shall
14 recommend approval and adoption of the terms and conditions of this Agreement by the Board in
15 resolution of this Complaint. While seeking Board acceptance, approval and adoption of this
16 Agreement, counsel for the IC may communicate directly with the Board staff and the
17 adjudicating members of the Board.

18 Respondent acknowledges that such contacts and communications may be made or
19 conducted ex-parte, without notice or opportunity to be heard on her part until the public Board
20 meeting where this Agreement is discussed, and that such contacts and communications may
21 include, but may not be limited to, matters concerning this Agreement, the Complaint and all
22 information of every nature whatsoever related to this matter. The IC and its counsel agree that
23 Respondent and/or Counsel for the Respondent may appear at the Board meeting where this
24 Agreement is discussed and, if requested, respond to any questions that may be addressed to the
25 IC or the IC's counsel.

26 8. Effect of Acceptance of Agreement by Board. In the event the Board accepts,
27 approves, and adopts this Agreement, the Board shall issue a final order, making this Agreement

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1 an order of the Board, and, pending full compliance with the terms herein, the case shall be closed
2 and all remaining claims arising out of the Complaint shall be dismissed with prejudice.

3 9. **Effect of Rejection of Agreement by Board.** In the event the Board does not
4 accept, approve and adopt this Agreement, this Agreement shall be null, void and of no force and
5 effect except as to the following agreement regarding adjudications: (1) Respondent agrees that,
6 notwithstanding rejection of this Agreement by the Board, nothing contained in this Agreement
7 and nothing that occurs pursuant to efforts of the IC to seek the Board's acceptance of this
8 Agreement shall disqualify any member of the adjudicating panel of the Board from considering
9 this Complaint and from participating in disciplinary proceedings against Respondent, including
10 adjudication of this case; and (2) Respondent further agrees that she shall not seek to disqualify
11 any such member absent evidence of bad faith.

12 10. **Binding Effect.** If approved by the Board, Respondent understands that this
13 Agreement is a binding and enforceable contract upon Respondent and the Board.

14 11. **Forum Selection Clause.** The parties agree that in the event either party is
15 required to seek enforcement of this Agreement in district court, the party's consent to such
16 jurisdiction and agree that exclusive jurisdiction shall be in the Second Judicial District Court,
17 State of Nevada, Washoe County.

18 12. **Attorneys' Fees and Costs.** The parties agree that in the event an action is
19 commenced in district court to enforce any provision of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall
20 be entitled to recover reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.


21 13. **Failure to Comply with Terms.** Should Respondent fail to comply with any term
22 or condition of this Agreement once the Agreement has been accepted, approved, and adopted by
23 the Board, the IC shall be authorized to immediately suspend Respondent's license to practice
24 medicine in Nevada pending an Order to Show Cause Hearing, which will be duly noticed.
25 Failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement, including failure to pay any fines, costs,
26 expenses, or fees owed to the Board, is a failure to comply with an order of the Board, which may
27 result in additional disciplinary action being taken against Respondent. NRS 630.3065(2)(a).

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1 Further, Respondent's failure to remit payment to the Board for monies agreed to be paid as a
2 condition of this Agreement may subject Respondent to civil collection efforts.


