10 **SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT** *By [Signature]*

11 The Investigative Committee (IC) of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners
12 (Board), by and through Aaron Bart Fricke, J.D., General Counsel for the Board and attorney for
13 the IC, and Robert Stephen Fredericks, M.D., (Respondent), a licensed physician in Nevada,
14 assisted by his attorney, Jeremy R. Reichenberg, Esq., of Gunderson Law Firm, hereby enter into
15 this Settlement Agreement (Agreement) based on the following:¹

16 **A. BACKGROUND**

17 1. Respondent is a medical doctor currently licensed in active status by the Board
18 pursuant to Chapter 630 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and Chapter 630 of the Nevada
19 Administrative Code (NAC) (collectively, the Medical Practice Act) to practice medicine in
20 Nevada. His license was originally issued on March 29, 1980 (License No. 4014).

21 2. On April 20th, 2022, in Case No. 22-5901-1, the IC filed a formal Complaint
22 (Complaint) charging Respondent with violating the Medical Practice Act. Specifically, the
23 Complaint alleges one (1) violation of NRS 630.3062(1)(h), Unauthorized and Inappropriate
24 Prescribing of a Controlled Substance Listed in Schedule II, III or IV (Count I); and one (1)
25 violation of NRS 630.3062(1)(g), Failure to Comply with the Requirements of NRS 639.23507

27 ¹ All agreements and admissions made by Respondent are solely for final disposition of this matter and any
28 subsequent related administrative proceedings or civil litigation involving the Board and Respondent. Therefore,
Respondent's agreements and admissions are not intended or made for any other use, such as in the context of another
state or federal government regulatory agency proceeding, state or federal civil or criminal proceeding, any state or
federal court proceeding, or any credentialing or privileges matter.

1 (Count II). By reason of the foregoing, Respondent is subject to discipline by the Board as
2 provided in NRS 630.352.

3 3. Respondent was properly served with a copy of this Complaint, has reviewed and
4 understands this Complaint, and has had the opportunity to consult with competent counsel
5 concerning the nature and significance of this Complaint.

6 4. Respondent is hereby advised of his rights regarding this administrative matter, and
7 of his opportunity to defend against the allegations in the Complaint. Specifically, Respondent has
8 certain rights in this administrative matter as set out by the United States Constitution, the Nevada
9 Constitution, the Medical Practice Act, the Nevada Open Meeting Law (OML), which is
10 contained in NRS Chapter 241, and the Nevada Administrative Procedure Act (APA), which is
11 contained in NRS Chapter 233B and 622A. These rights include the right to a formal hearing on
12 the allegations in the Complaint, the right to representation by counsel, at [his/her] own expense,
13 in the preparation and presentation of his defense, the right to confront and cross-examine the
14 witnesses and evidence against him, the right to written findings of fact, conclusions of law and
15 order reflecting the final decision of the Board, and the right to judicial review of the Board's
16 order, if the decision is adverse to him.

17 5. Respondent understands that, under the Board's charge to protect the public by
18 regulating the practice of medicine, the Board may take disciplinary action against Respondent's
19 license, including license probation, license suspension, license revocation and imposition of
20 administrative fines, as well as any other reasonable requirement or limitation, if the Board
21 concludes that Respondent violated one or more provisions of the Medical Practice Act.

22 6. Respondent understands and agrees that this Agreement, by and between
23 Respondent and the IC, is not with the Board, and that the IC will present this Agreement to the
24 Board for consideration in open session at a duly noticed and scheduled meeting. Respondent
25 understands that the IC shall advocate for the Board's approval of this Agreement, but that the
26 Board has the right to decide in its own discretion whether or not to approve this Agreement.
27 Respondent further understands and agrees that if the Board approves this Agreement, then the
28 terms and conditions enumerated below shall be binding and enforceable upon Respondent and

1 the Board.

2 **B. TERMS & CONDITIONS**

3 **NOW, THEREFORE**, in order to resolve the matters addressed herein, i.e., the matters
4 with regard to the Complaint, Respondent and the IC hereby agree to the following terms and
5 conditions:

6 1. **Jurisdiction.** Respondent is, and at all times relevant to the Complaint has been, a
7 physician licensed to practice medicine in Nevada subject to the jurisdiction of the Board as set
8 forth in the Medical Practice Act.

9 2. **Representation by Counsel/Knowing, Willing and Intelligent Agreement.**
10 Respondent acknowledges he is represented by counsel, and wishes to resolve the matters
11 addressed herein with said counsel. Respondent agrees that if representation by counsel in this
12 matter materially changes prior to entering into this Agreement and for the duration of this
13 Agreement, that counsel for the IC will be timely notified of the material change. Respondent
14 agrees that he knowingly, willingly and intelligently enters into this Agreement after deciding to
15 have a full consultation with and upon the advice of legal counsel.

16 3. **Waiver of Rights.** In connection with this Agreement, and the associated terms
17 and conditions, Respondent knowingly, willingly and intelligently waives all rights in connection
18 with this administrative matter. Respondent hereby knowingly, willingly and intelligently waives
19 all rights arising under the United States Constitution, the Nevada Constitution, the Medical
20 Practice Act, the OML, the APA, and any other legal rights that may be available to him or that
21 may apply to him in connection with the administrative proceedings resulting from the Complaint
22 filed in this matter, including defense of the Complaint, adjudication of the allegations set forth in
23 the Complaint, and imposition of any disciplinary actions or sanctions ordered by the Board.
24 Respondent agrees to settle and resolve the allegations of the Complaint as set out by this
25 Agreement, without a hearing or any further proceedings and without the right to judicial review.

26 4. **Acknowledgement of Reasonable Basis to Proceed.** As of the time of entering
27 into this Settlement Agreement, the allegations of the Complaint remain unproven. Respondent
28 acknowledges that the IC believes it has a reasonable basis to allege that Respondent engaged in

1 conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the Medical Practice Act. The IC acknowledges
2 that Respondent is agreeing to resolve this matter to avoid the costs of hearing and potential
3 subsequent litigation. Respondent asserts if this matter were to proceed to hearing, he has
4 evidence, witnesses, expert witness(es) and defenses to the counts/claims alleged in the
5 Complaint, but for the purposes of resolving the matter and for no other purpose, Respondent
6 waives the presentation of evidence, witnesses, expert witnesses, and defenses in order to
7 effectuate this Agreement.

8 5. Consent to Entry of Order. In order to resolve this Complaint pending against
9 Respondent, Respondent hereby agrees that the Board may issue an order finding that Respondent
10 engaged in conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the Medical Practice Act.
11 Accordingly, the following terms and conditions are hereby agreed upon:

12 a. Respondent admits to Counts I and II, one (1) violation of
13 NRS 630.3062(1)(h), Unauthorized and Inappropriate Prescribing of a Controlled Substance
14 Listed in Schedule II, III or IV (Count I), and one (1) violation of NRS 630.3062(1)(g), Failure to
15 Comply with the Requirements of NRS 639.23507 (Count II).

16 b. Respondent shall pay the costs and expenses incurred in the investigation
17 and prosecution of the above-referenced matter in the total amount of thirteen thousand seven
18 hundred ninety-three dollars and fifty-one cents (\$13,793.51). Respondent shall pay these
19 aforementioned costs and expenses in twelve (12) equal payments of one thousand one hundred
20 forty-nine dollars and forty-six cents (\$1,149.46). The first payment shall be due on or before
21 August 10, 2022, the second payment due on or before September 10, 2022, and each successive
22 payment due on or before the tenth day of each month thereafter, with the final payment of one
23 thousand one hundred forty-nine dollars and forty-five cents (\$1,149.45) due on or before
24 July 10, 2023. The costs and expenses as well as the payment plan are subject to the Board's
25 acceptance, adoption and approval of this Agreement.

26 c. Respondent shall pay a fine of two thousand five hundred dollars
27 (\$2,500.00). Respondent shall pay the aforementioned fine in twelve (12) equal payments of two
28 hundred eight dollars and thirty-three cents (\$208.33). The first payment shall be due on or before

1 August 10, 2022, the second payment due on or before September 10, 2022, and each successive
2 payment due on or before the tenth day of each month thereafter, with the final payment of two
3 hundred eight dollars and thirty-seven cents (\$208.37) due on or before July 10, 2023. The fine as
4 well as the payment plan are subject to the Board's acceptance, adoption and approval of this
5 Agreement.

6 d. Respondent shall complete twenty-one (21) hours of continuing medical
7 education (CME) regarding Best Practices in Prescribing of Controlled Substances within six (6)
8 months of the date of the Board's acceptance, adoption and approval of this Agreement. The
9 aforementioned hours of CME shall be in addition to any CME requirements that are regularly
10 imposed upon Respondent as a condition of licensure in the State of Nevada, and shall be
11 approved by the Board to meet this requirement prior to their completion, and proof of completion
12 shall be provided to the Board.

13 e. Respondent shall, for a period of three (3) years from the Board's
14 acceptance, adoption and approval of this Agreement, specifically comply with all laws pertaining
15 to the dispensing, prescribing or administration of controlled substances and dangerous drugs,
16 including but not limited to, the requirements of NRS 453.163, 453.164, 453.226, 639.23507,
17 639.23535 and 639.2391 to 639.23916, inclusive, and any other regulations adopted by the State
18 Board of Pharmacy pursuant thereto.

19 f. Respondent shall, for a period of three (3) years from the Board's
20 acceptance, adoption and approval of this Agreement, specifically comply with the requirements
21 of NRS 630.306(1)(f), in so doing, he shall not perform any procedure or prescribe any therapy
22 which by the current standards of the practice of medicine is experimental without first obtaining
23 the informed consent of the patient or the patient's family.

24 g. This Agreement shall be reported to the appropriate entities and parties as
25 required by law, including, but not limited to, the National Practitioner Data Bank.

26 h. Respondent shall receive a Public Letter of Reprimand.

27 i. The remaining counts of the Complaint, if any, and any other claims arising
28 from the Board's corresponding investigative case file(s) and any other investigative cases

1 pending as of the date this Agreement is executed by the Respondent, shall be dismissed with
2 prejudice.

3 6. Release from Liability. In execution of this Agreement, Respondent understands
4 and agrees that the State of Nevada, the Board, and each of its members, staff, counsel,
5 investigators, experts, peer reviewers, committees, panels, hearing officers, consultants and agents
6 are immune from civil liability for any decision or action taken in good faith in response to
7 information acquired by the Board. NRS 630.364(2)(a). Respondent agrees to release the State of
8 Nevada, the Board, and each of its members, staff, counsel, investigators, experts, peer reviewers,
9 committees, panels, hearing officers, consultants and agents from any and all manner of actions,
10 causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims and demands whatsoever, known and
11 unknown, in law or equity, that Respondent ever had, now has, may have or claim to have, against
12 any or all of the persons, government agencies or entities named in this paragraph arising out of,
13 or by reason of, this investigation, this Agreement or the administration of the case referenced
14 herein.

15 7. Procedure for Adoption of Agreement. The IC and counsel for the IC shall
16 recommend approval and adoption of the terms and conditions of this Agreement by the Board in
17 resolution of this Complaint. In the course of seeking Board acceptance, approval and adoption of
18 this Agreement, counsel for the IC may communicate directly with the Board staff and the
19 adjudicating members of the Board.

20 Respondent acknowledges that such contacts and communications may be made or
21 conducted ex-parte, without notice or opportunity to be heard on his part until the public Board
22 meeting where this Agreement is discussed, and that such contacts and communications may
23 include, but may not be limited to, matters concerning this Agreement, the Complaint and any and
24 all information of every nature whatsoever related to this matter. The IC and its counsel agree that
25 Respondent and/or Counsel for the Respondent may appear at the Board meeting where this
26 Agreement is discussed and, if requested, respond to any questions that may be addressed to the
27 IC or the IC's counsel.

28 ///

1 8. Effect of Acceptance of Agreement by Board. In the event the Board accepts,
2 approves and adopts this Agreement, the Board shall issue a final order, making this Agreement
3 an order of the Board, and, pending full compliance with the terms herein, the case shall be closed
4 and any other claims arising from the Board's corresponding investigative case file(s) and any
5 other investigative cases pending as of the date this Agreement is executed by the Respondent,
6 shall be dismissed with prejudice.

7 9. Effect of Rejection of Agreement by Board. In the event the Board does not
8 accept, approve and adopt this Agreement, this Agreement shall be null, void and of no force and
9 effect except as to the following agreement regarding adjudications: (1) Respondent agrees that,
10 notwithstanding rejection of this Agreement by the Board, nothing contained in this Agreement
11 and nothing that occurs pursuant to efforts of the IC to seek the Board's acceptance of this
12 Agreement shall disqualify any member of the adjudicating panel of the Board from considering
13 this Complaint and from participating in disciplinary proceedings against Respondent, including
14 adjudication of this case; and (2) Respondent further agrees that he shall not seek to disqualify any
15 such member absent evidence of bad faith.

16 10. Binding Effect. If approved by the Board, Respondent understands that this
17 Agreement is a binding and enforceable contract upon Respondent and the Board.

18 11. Forum Selection Clause. The parties agree that in the event either party is
19 required to seek enforcement of this Agreement in district court, the party's consent to such
20 jurisdiction and agree that exclusive jurisdiction shall be in the Second Judicial District Court,
21 State of Nevada, Washoe County.

22 12. Attorneys' Fees and Costs. The parties agree that in the event an action is
23 commenced in district court to enforce any provision of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall
24 be entitled to recover reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.

25 13. Failure to Comply with Terms. Should Respondent fail to comply with any term
26 or condition of this Agreement once the Agreement has been accepted, approved and adopted by
27 the Board, the IC shall be authorized to immediately suspend Respondent's license to practice
28 medicine in Nevada pending an Order to Show Cause Hearing, which will be duly noticed.

1 Failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement, including failure to pay any fines, costs,
2 expenses or fees owed to the Board, is a failure to comply with an order of the Board, which may
3 result in additional disciplinary action being taken against Respondent. NRS 630.3065(2)(a).
4 Further, Respondent's failure to remit payment to the Board for monies agreed to be paid as a
5 condition of this Agreement may subject Respondent to civil collection efforts.
