10 **SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

11 The Investigative Committee (IC) of the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners
12 (Board), by and through Donald K. White, Senior Deputy General Counsel for the Board and
13 attorney for the IC, and Eric M. Math, M.D. (Respondent), a licensed physician in Nevada,
14 assisted by his attorney, Hal R. Taylor, Esq., of the law firm of Hal Taylor, Attorney at Law,
15 hereby enter into this Settlement Agreement (Agreement) based on the following:¹

16 **A. Background**

17 1. Respondent is a medical doctor currently licensed in expired status by the Board
18 pursuant to Chapter 630 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and Chapter 630 of the Nevada
19 Administrative Code (NAC) (collectively, the Medical Practice Act). His license was originally
20 issued on December 18, 1998 (License No. 8878).

21 2. On March 9, 2021, in Case No. 21-10474-1, the IC filed a formal Complaint
22 (Complaint) charging Respondent with violating the Medical Practice Act. Specifically, the
23 Complaint alleges one (1) violation of NRS 630.306(l)(c), Illegal Distribution of Controlled
24 Substances (Count I), one (1) violation of NRS 630.306(l)(p), Unsafe or Unprofessional Conduct

state or federal government regulatory agency proceeding, state or federal civil or criminal proceeding, any state or
federal court proceeding, or any credentialing or privileges matter.

1 (Count II), and one (1) violation of NRS 630.301(9), Disreputable Conduct (Count III). By reason
2 of the foregoing, Respondent is subject to discipline by the Board as provided in NRS 630.352.

3 3. Respondent was properly served with a copy of the Complaint, has reviewed and
4 understands the Complaint, and has had the opportunity to consult with competent counsel
5 concerning the nature and significance of the Complaint.

6 4. Respondent is hereby advised of his rights regarding this administrative matter, and
7 of his opportunity to defend against the allegations in the Complaint. Specifically, Respondent has
8 certain rights in this administrative matter as set out by the United States Constitution, the Nevada
9 Constitution, the Medical Practice Act, the Nevada Open Meeting Law (OML), which is
10 contained in NRS Chapter 241, and the Nevada Administrative Procedure Act (APA), which is
11 contained in NRS Chapters 233B and 622A. These rights include the right to a formal hearing on
12 the allegations in the Complaint, the right to representation by counsel, at his own expense, in the
13 preparation and presentation of his defense, the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses
14 and evidence against him, the right to written findings of fact, conclusions of law and order
15 reflecting the final decision of the Board, and the right to judicial review of the Board's order, if
16 the decision is adverse to him.

17 5. Respondent understands that, under the Board's charge to protect the public by
18 regulating the practice of medicine, the Board may take disciplinary action against Respondent's
19 license, including license probation, license suspension, license revocation and imposition of
20 administrative fines, as well as any other reasonable requirement or limitation, if the Board
21 concludes that Respondent violated one or more provisions of the Medical Practice Act.

22 6. Respondent understands and agrees that this Agreement, by and between
23 Respondent and the IC, is not with the Board, and that the IC will present this Agreement to the
24 Board for consideration in open session at a duly noticed and scheduled meeting. Respondent
25 understands that the IC shall advocate for the Board's approval of this Agreement, but that the
26 Board has the right to decide in its own discretion whether or not to approve this Agreement.
27 Respondent further understands and agrees that if the Board approves this Agreement, then the
28 terms and conditions enumerated below shall be binding and enforceable upon him and the Board.

1 **B. TERMS & CONDITIONS**

2 **NOW, THEREFORE**, in order to resolve the matters addressed herein, i.e., the matters
3 with regard to the Complaint, Respondent and the IC hereby agree to the following terms and
4 conditions:

5 **1. Jurisdiction.** Respondent is, and at all times relevant to the Complaint has been, a
6 physician licensed to practice medicine in Nevada, currently in inactive status and subject to the
7 jurisdiction of the Board as set forth in the Medical Practice Act.

8 **2. Representation by Counsel/Knowing, Willing and Intelligent Agreement.**
9 Respondent acknowledges he is represented by counsel and wishes to resolve the matters
10 addressed herein with said counsel. Respondent agrees that if representation by counsel in this
11 matter materially changes prior to entering into this Agreement and for the duration of this
12 Agreement, that counsel for the IC will be timely notified of the material change. Respondent
13 agrees that he knowingly, willingly and intelligently enters into this Agreement after deciding to
14 have a full consultation with and upon the advice of legal counsel.

15 **3. Waiver of Rights.** In connection with this Agreement, and the associated terms
16 and conditions, Respondent knowingly, willingly and intelligently waives all rights in connection
17 with this administrative matter. Respondent hereby knowingly, willingly and intelligently waives
18 all rights arising under the United States Constitution, the Nevada Constitution, the Medical
19 Practice Act, the OML, the APA, and any other legal rights that may be available to him or that
20 may apply to him in connection with the administrative proceedings resulting from the Complaint
21 filed in this matter, including defense of the Complaint, adjudication of the allegations set forth in
22 the Complaint, and imposition of any disciplinary actions or sanctions ordered by the Board.
23 Respondent agrees to settle and resolve the allegations of the Complaint as set out by this
24 Agreement, without a hearing or any further proceedings and without the right to judicial review.

25 **4. Acknowledgement of Reasonable Basis to Proceed.** As of the time of entering
26 into this Settlement Agreement, the allegations of the Complaint remain unproven. Respondent
27 acknowledges that the IC believes it has a reasonable basis to allege that Respondent engaged in
28 conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the Medical Practice Act. The IC acknowledges

1 Respondent is not admitting that the IC's claims/counts as alleged in the Complaint have merit
2 and Respondent is agreeing to resolve this matter to avoid the costs of hearing and potential
3 subsequent litigation. Respondent asserts if this matter were to proceed to hearing, he has
4 evidence, witnesses, expert witness(es) and defenses to the counts/claims alleged in the
5 Complaint, but for the purposes of resolving the matter and for no other purpose, Respondent
6 waives the presentation of evidence, witnesses, expert witnesses, and defenses in order to
7 effectuate this Agreement.

8 **5. Consent to Entry of Order.** In order to resolve the Complaint pending against
9 Respondent, Respondent hereby agrees that the Board may issue an order finding that Respondent
10 engaged in conduct that is grounds for discipline pursuant to the Medical Practice Act.
11 Accordingly, the following terms and conditions are hereby agreed upon:

12 a. Respondent admits to Count I of the Complaint, one (1) violation of
13 NRS 630.306(1)(c), Illegal Distribution of Controlled Substances.

14 b. Respondent will immediately cease the practice of medicine and shall voluntarily
15 surrender his license to practice medicine within the State of Nevada, License No. 8878, pursuant
16 to NAC 630.240. Respondent will submit a sworn written statement of such surrender, along with
17 his actual license, to the Board at 9600 Gateway Drive, Reno, NV 89521.

18 b. Respondent agrees that he will not be eligible to reapply for licensure to practice
19 medicine within the State of Nevada for three (3) years from the date of the Board's acceptance,
20 adoption, and approval of this Agreement as an Order of the Board or not before March 1, 2027.
21 Should, however, Respondent be released from prison earlier than his sentence of thirty-seven
22 (37) months and be placed on supervised release, Respondent may then reapply for a license to
23 practice medicine in the State of Nevada and agrees to be placed on immediate probation, subject
24 to the terms and conditions of his criminal probation.

25 c. Respondent will pay the costs and expenses incurred in the investigation and
26 prosecution of this matter, which imposition of costs and expenses shall be effective upon the
27 Board's acceptance, adoption and approval of this Agreement, the current amount being two
28 thousand five hundred seventy-six dollars and eleven cents (\$2,576.11). This Board order for the

1 payment of costs shall be immediately stayed, until which time as Respondent reapplies for
2 licensure, at which time, Respondent is ordered to immediately pay the full aforementioned costs
3 and fees before his medical license may be issued.

4 d. Respondent shall pay a fine of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00),
5 which imposition of fines shall be effective upon the Board's acceptance, adoption and approval of
6 this Agreement. This Board order for the payment of a fine shall be immediately stayed, until
7 which time as Respondent reapplies for licensure, at which time, Respondent is ordered to
8 immediately pay the full aforementioned fine before his medical license may be issued.

9 e. This Agreement shall be reported to the appropriate entities and parties as required
10 by law, including, but not limited to, the National Practitioner Data Bank.

11 f. Respondent shall receive a Public Letter of Reprimand.

12 g. The remaining counts of the Complaint, and any other claims arising from the
13 Board's corresponding investigative case file(s), shall be dismissed with prejudice.

14 **6. Release From Liability.** In execution of this Agreement, Respondent understands
15 and agrees that the State of Nevada, the Board, and each of its members, staff, counsel,
16 investigators, experts, peer reviewers, committees, panels, hearing officers, consultants and agents
17 are immune from civil liability for any decision or action taken in good faith in response to
18 information acquired by the Board. NRS 630.364(2)(a). Respondent agrees to release the State of
19 Nevada, the Board, and each of its members, staff, counsel, investigators, experts, peer reviewers,
20 committees, panels, hearing officers, consultants and agents from any and all manner of actions,
21 causes of action, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims and demands whatsoever, known and
22 unknown, in law or equity, that Respondent ever had, now has, may have or claim to have, against
23 any or all of the persons, government agencies or entities named in this paragraph arising out of,
24 or by reason of, this investigation, this Agreement or the administration of the case referenced
25 herein.

26 **7. Procedure for Adoption of Agreement.** The IC and counsel for the IC shall
27 recommend approval and adoption of the terms and conditions of this Agreement by the Board in
28 resolution of the Complaint. In the course of seeking Board acceptance, approval and adoption of

1 this Agreement, counsel for the IC may communicate directly with the Board staff and the
2 adjudicating members of the Board.

3 Respondent acknowledges that such contacts and communications may be made or
4 conducted ex parte, without notice or opportunity to be heard on his part until the public Board
5 meeting where this Agreement is discussed, and that such contacts and communications may
6 include, but may not be limited to, matters concerning this Agreement, the Complaint and any and
7 all information of every nature whatsoever related to this matter. The IC and its counsel agree that
8 Respondent and/or Counsel for the Respondent may appear at the Board meeting where this
9 Agreement is discussed and, if requested, respond to any questions that may be addressed to the
10 IC or the IC's counsel.

11 **8. Effect of Acceptance of Agreement by Board.** In the event the Board accepts,
12 approves and adopts this Agreement, the Board shall issue a final order, making this Agreement
13 an order of the Board, and, pending full compliance with the terms herein, the case shall be closed
14 and all remaining claims arising out of the Complaint shall be dismissed with prejudice.

15 **9. Effect of Rejection of Agreement by Board.** In the event the Board does not
16 accept, approve and adopt this Agreement, this Agreement shall be null, void and of no force and
17 effect except as to the following agreement regarding adjudications: (1) Respondent agrees that,
18 notwithstanding rejection of this Agreement by the Board, nothing contained in this Agreement
19 and nothing that occurs pursuant to efforts of the IC to seek the Board's acceptance of this
20 Agreement shall disqualify any member of the adjudicating panel of the Board from considering
21 the Complaint and from participating in disciplinary proceedings against Respondent, including
22 adjudication of this case; and (2) Respondent further agrees that he shall not seek to disqualify any
23 such member absent evidence of bad faith.

24 **10. Binding Effect.** If approved by the Board, Respondent understands that this
25 Agreement is a binding and enforceable contract upon Respondent and the Board.

26 **11. Forum Selection Clause.** The parties agree that in the event either party is
27 required to seek enforcement of this Agreement in district court, the parties consent to such

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1 jurisdiction and agree that exclusive jurisdiction shall be in the Second Judicial District Court,
2 State of Nevada, Washoe County.

3 **12. Attorneys' Fees and Costs.** The parties agree that in the event an action is
4 commenced in district court to enforce any provision of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall
5 be entitled to recover reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.

6 **13. Failure to Comply with Terms.** Should Respondent fail to comply with any term
7 or condition of this Agreement once the Agreement has been accepted, approved and adopted by
8 the Board, the IC shall be authorized to immediately suspend Respondent's license to practice
9 medicine in Nevada, if any, pending an Order to Show Cause Hearing, which will be duly noticed.
10 Failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement, including failure to pay any fines, costs,
11 expenses or fees owed to the Board, is a failure to comply with an order of the Board, which may
12 result in additional disciplinary action being taken against Respondent. NRS 630.3065(2)(a).

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1 Further, Respondent's failure to remit payment to the Board for monies agreed to be paid
2 as a condition of this Agreement may subject Respondent to any civil and administrative
3 collection efforts.
